Year 3 Non-negotiables

Number:

Derive facts from known facts (multiplication / division and addition / subtraction)

Begin to count in tenths

Multiply by 10 and 100 recognising the importance of place value

Read scales in steps of 2, 3, 4, 5 and 10

Shape and measure:


Identify right angles and that two right angles make a half turn
