Homework

Multiplication and Division

Perimeter and Area

- To calculate the perimeter of rectilinear shapes ensuring the length of all sides are included.
- To use multiplication to calculate the area of rectangles.
- To use different strategies to calculate the area of rectilinear shapes.
- To compare the area and perimeter of rectangles.
- To give reasonable estimates of non-rectilinear shapes on a grid.

Literacy

Myths

- Write a new version of Prometheus and Pandora from a human's point of view.
- Includes conjunctions and adverbs to build cohesion within and across paragraphs.

Instructions

- Identify key features of instruction texts.
